If you feel like you are using more plastic than ever before, you are not alone! There has been an increase in the use of plastic because of the COVID pandemic. Plastic grocery bags once again became the norm, a surge in on-line shopping resulted in more plastic packaging, single-use utensils and take-out food containers were everywhere, and almost everyone was using personal protective equipment (PPE) daily just to name a few examples. A February 2021¹ study estimated the amount of plastic wastes generated worldwide since the pandemic is 1.6 million metric tons per day, almost triple, compared to 663,000 metric tons in 2016.² Now you may be wondering, how much is 1.6 million metric tons? Well it is equivalent in weight to approximately 10,600 jumbo jets.³ Roger that!!!

There is no better time than now to think about lowering your plastic consumption and being part of the solution to plastic pollution. <u>Plastic Free July</u> is a global movement that helps millions of people around the world reduce single-use plastic waste every day at home, work, school, and in your community.

Reducing plastic pollution starts with each one of us. Following are some simple steps to reduce our plastic use right now.

- 1. Carry and use reusable shopping bags; most places are allowing this again. Don't forget your reusable produce bags as well.
- 2. Rethink your coffee For starters, ditch those pesky K-cup machines and use a reusable cup even when hitting the coffee shop.
- 3. Avoid plastic bottled water.
- 4. Say no to single-use plastic cutlery.
- 5. Ditch the cling wrap and disposable baggies and instead use beeswax wraps and reusable baggies.
